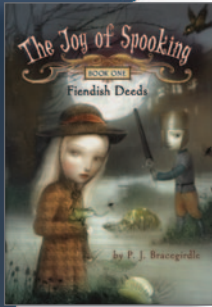

by P. J. Bracegirdle

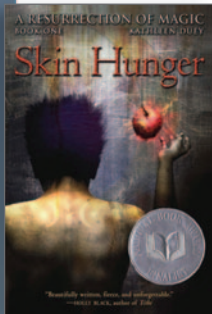
Narrated by Katherine Kellgren

by Louise Erdrich

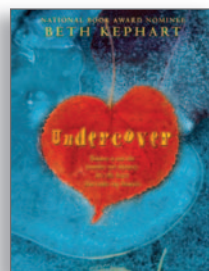

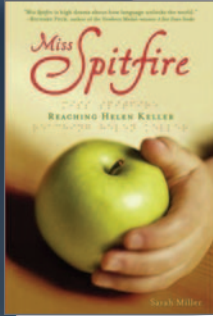

8. MISS SPITFIRE

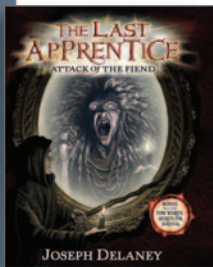
by Sarah Miller

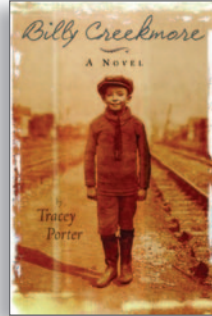
9. SEER OF SHADOWS

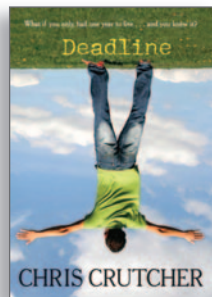
